Promoting Peace with a Simple Message



Editor's Note: While this month's newsletter is focused almost exclusively on all the district conference news (we are saving club stories for our June edition), we felt this story belonged with this issue. Why? Because it highlights our focus on peace and the power of working together, across districts and clubs, to make a difference.

On April 19, the Rotary Club of North Cobb collaborated with the Rotary Club of Winder and its President Al Darby and Barrow area Rotary Clubs to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Apalachee High School by planting a Peace Pole in front of the school. This was followed by a sumptuous barbecue for over 250 staff, students, first responders, supporters and community members.

The Peace Pole was created by the students of Devereaux Advanced Behavioral Center (some of the most vulnerable children in our community). Its message - "May Peace Prevail on Earth" - was translated to the Cherokee language and Spanish, in addition to its English version. The Cherokee Nation was represented at the event by Re. Dr. Jones.

DG Gordon Owens (6900) and DG Bobby Hildreth (6910) attended the event. Gordon said, "it amazes me how such a simple peace pole can be so meaningful."

Dr Ada Wikina reiterated that. "For us in Rotary, peace is more than a concept - it's action, it's community, it's a legacy. Through our work, we strive to creating lasting, meaningful change. And we know that when we come together, our ability to spread peace grows stronger and wider."

The first recipient is GRSP student Atche Bilyal, who received her award from District 6910 GRSP District Chair James McCoy at the April 22 meeting of the Rotary Club of Hall County, one of Atche's three sponsoring clubs - Hall County, Gainesville and white County. Atche is a student at Brenau University. She received this honor for "advancing World Peace through Understanding, exhibiting extraordinary leadership and serving as an international ambassador for Bulgaria and GRSP.

Atche's many Service Above Self accomplishments led to her selection as the first recipient of this award

- Atche founded the only international Rotaract Club in the 1610 District, Rotaract Club of Tilburg International, with the support of Rotary District 1610 Zuid-West of Netherlands, which turned out

to be a great success

- She helped organize area Rotarians here and participated in the Women Build 2025 with Habitat for Humanity
- She showed an immediate desire to connect and assist family businesses in North Georgia, winning Brenau's Annual Speech Competition followed by her research and journey presented at the National Conference on Undergraduate REsearch in Pittsburgh this April

We were impressed by Atche's desire to learn network and experience American culture from Rotarians and her fellow GRSP classmates. In addition to this award, Atche was honored as a Top 5 Finalist for the International Youth Representative for the Europe, Mediterranean and Arab States Region for the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Foundation.
