Wes Smith conducted the invocation, led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance and Four Way Test and did a Meet Your Rotarian talk.



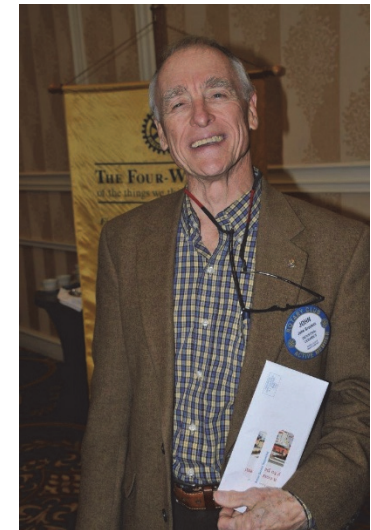
President Keith Funderburk drew the winning raffle ticket.
