

District 6900 Competitive Grant Opportunity - \$35,000 Total Funding Available!

Goal: Empower Rotary Clubs in District 6900 to launch impactful, sustainable projects that address local community needs and advance Rotary's mission.

Grant Criteria & Eligibility

Club Grant Eligible as defined on the D6900 website, visit:

- The following items must be a green "Yes" on the grant eligibility page:
 1. Club president attended the President-Elect Learning Seminar "PELS"
 2. Club goals must be entered in Rotary Club Central (rcc.rotary.org)
 3. Club Membership Action Plan (MAP) must be entered in Dacdb.com (membershipactionplan.org)
 4. Rotary International and District 6900 dues must be current
 5. Club officers must be entered in my.rotary.org
 6. Prior community and global grants are completed.

Project Focus

- Grant must align with one or more of Rotary's Areas of Focus.
 - Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene, Maternal and Child Health, Basic Education and Literacy, Community Economic Development, and Protecting the Environment.
 - Grant must include active Club Rotarian participation.
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Funding Details

- Maximum grant size per club: \$7,000
- Total pool available: \$35,000

Application Process

- Deadline to Apply: September 1, 2025
 - Submit a detailed and compelling grant submission on Rotary6900.org to include:
 1. The Problem
 2. Impact
 3. Rotary Volunteer Involvement
 4. Public Image Impact
 - Club President and Foundation Chair must approve the Grant Request
 - Signed Memorandum of Understanding (within the grant system)
 - The grant project **cannot begin until after receiving the grant check** and must be completed by March 31, 2026 (no exceptions)
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Scoring – Judges from District 6900 will review the Competitive Grant applications with an emphasis given to the following: 1) defining the problem and need; 2) clear goals and expected impact; 3) budget details; 4) clear timeline for project; 5) Rotarian involvement; and 6) how well you let the public know that Rotary made this happen.

Final Reporting Requirements

- Due: March 31, 2026
- Upload to the District 6900 Grants site:
 - Receipts, matching invoices, and bank statements
 - Photos of the project with Rotarian involvement
 - Beneficiary count (How many people can directly benefit from the project)
 - Rotary volunteer hours

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
